Cruise Week Tentative Schedule

For those of you planning on enjoying the two week cruise this summer, here is the preliminary information for you to consider.

Cruise Week 2 will have a different format this year as the extended cruise will leave Hampton Roads a week in advance of the one week cruise and meet the one week cruisers on the return leg. The highlight of this years cruise will be a two night stop in Baltimore's Inner Harbor. The two week cruise will depart Hampton Roads on Saturday, June 21 and is scheduled to return on Sunday, July 6. The tentative itinerary is listed below.

Monday - June 23: Herrington Harbor South (marina) or West/Rhode River (anchorage)

Wednesday - June 25: Baltimore Inner Harbor East Marina

Thursday - June 26: Baltimore Inner Harbor East Marina

Friday - June 27: Worton Creek (marina, mooring ball or anchorage)

Saturday - June 28: Rock Hall (marina or anchorage)

Sunday - June 29: Wye River (anchorage)

Monday - June 30: La Trappe Creek (anchorage) or Cambridge (marina or anchorage)

Tuesday- July 1: Oxford (marina or anchorage)

Wednesday - July 2: Solomons (marina or anchorage)

Thursday - July 3: Chrisfield-Spring Cove Marina

Friday - July 4: Chrisfield-Spring Cove Marina

Saturday - July 5: Piankatank River (marina or anchorage)

We are trying to get an approximate boat count for the two week cruise. If you are planning on going, please contact Jim Dombey at jfandlasailingd@juno.com and let him know that you are planning on coming. This will help in planning any other events during the cruise. There will be a Captain's meeting on Wednesday, June 11, so mark that date on your calendar.

Also, Fleet 30 has a block of slips reserved at the Inner Harbor East Marina in Baltimore. The cost is \$2.10 per foot. You should call the marina directly at 410-625-1700 to reserve a slip. Tell Captain Bill that you are with Hampton Roads Fleet 30 Sailing Club. Reservations should be made before June 10. Baltimore's Inner Harbor can be quite busy at that time of year.

Jim Dombey will be sending out info on the Spring Cove Marina reservations as that stopover will include the one week cruisers as well.

We have an exciting and aggressive schedule for this year's cruise and hope that the weather cooperates. In any event, we will be flexible.

We will be sending out more information as we get closer to the dates.

Racing News



It was good to see so many members at our Christmas party January 5th! Congratulations to Jim Lant for his surprise victory (especially to Jim!) as the Fleet 30 High Point Champion for

2007. This was the inaugural award in what we hope will be an annual award for the club, presented to the member that accumulates the most points over the season on the following scale:

- 1 point if you raced
- 2 points for 4th place
- 3 points for 3rd place
- 4 points for 2nd place
- 5 points for 1st place

I'll do my best to capture and record all our members' activity on the race course, but I would certainly appreciate a note just to be sure I don't miss anyone.

Saturday, February 2nd is the date for the racing clinic, "Murphy Goes Racing - 2008, Going Faster - It's all About the People" that I mentioned last month. I understand that the venue sold out a week or two ago - hope some of you made your ressesies early. Another date to mark on the calendar is Tuesday, April 1st (no joke!) at 6:30 pm at the Mariner's Museum in Newport News. This is the Cruising Club of Virginia's (CCV) date for their annual Racing Rules Seminar. It's free and open to the public. Don't worry; they keep it light and informative (about an hour).

More racing news: CCV announced a new evening race, the Moonlight Triangle Race, which will take place late in the day on July 26th with the finish probably around midnight after sailing a mid-distance course within the area between the mouth of the York River, Buckroe Beach and Ocean View. Note that this is the same Saturday as our Fleet 30 Willoughby Night Sail. Lots of opportunities for an evening sail that day! CCV also is offering Cruising Class racers who join CCV (Club membership = \$25) the opportunity to race FREE in any CCV race during the season (with the exception of SBRW). This is a great deal as the normal racing membership is \$110 - \$125.

Now that the Holidays are over, some of us may have made resolutions to shed a few pounds. Now's a great time to put the boat on a bit of a diet, too. (You *are* regularly visiting her, right?) Take the time to scrutinize all of the items that have been accumulating over the months that are making you consider repainting that waterline: all those buckets, brushes, & cleaners; folding chairs and roll-up dinghies, the spare sails in the V-berth you haven't bent on in three seasons, or all those paperbacks you didn't finish reading from Cruise Week. Little things do add up in weight and do affect sailing performance. About that BBQ on the stern rail - they'll cook you a hot dog at the race party!

The idea is to "lighten the ends" - remove as much weight as possible from the ends of the boat - it's preferable to have the weight concentrated over the keel as much as possible. This will

minimize the "hobby-horsing" effect and improve handling. Please note that cold beer is considered "movable ballast", which is very desirable on all sailboats and should not be included on the skipper's list of items to leave at the dock!
